BACKGROUND

- The Authority has a series of committees to which appointments are made at the first or annual meeting. These are set out below.
- The Authority in the past has determined not to apply political balance to the membership of its Committees under regulation 20 of the Local Government (Committees and Political Groups) Regulations 1990. This issue was revisited during the constitutional review in mid 2008-09. There has been a prevailing consensus that political balance would not be beneficial as the current arrangements are both inclusive and avoid creating any 'political division' in the governance of an Authority.

- The terms of reference of the above committees are included in the Constitution.
- Given that the constituent authorities are required to apply the principle of political balance to their committees (other than in the case of cabinets), authorities are encouraged to nominate members to this Authority on the basis of political balance. The Authority itself should consider annually whether it wishes to apply political balance noting the comments in 3 above. Should the Authority apply this principle, appointments to committees should be made which ensure that the constituent authorities all have sufficient representation.
- The membership of the Executive Panel consists of 14 members and comprises the Chair and Deputy Chair of the Authority and two members per constituent authority. This membership represents 50% of the Authority's membership. The role and membership of the Panel was expanded in the constitutional review in mid 2008-09.

The Authority agreed to introduce an Audit Committee to review, scrutinise and assure, independently of the Executive, the operational and financial performance of the organisation. The membership of the Committee is the remaining 50% of the membership who are not appointed to the Executive Panel.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

To appoint two Fire and Rescue Authority members to serve on the Standards Committee.

RECOMMENDATION

3 That the Authority appoints two members to serve on the Standards Committee until the next ordinary elections.

BACKGROUND

- 4 Under the Local Government Act 2000, the Fire and Rescue Authority is required to have a Standards Committee. There are four independent members on the committee.
- Two of the Committee's independent members live in Denbighshire and two live in Conwy. There are two males and two females and one of the males is a Welsh speaker.
- Any member of the Fire and Rescue Authority, apart from the Chair and Deputy Chair, can be appointed to serve on the Standards Committee.
- 7 Under the Standards Committee (Wales) Regulations 2001, the political balance requirements of Part I of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 do not apply to these appointments.

ADVICE

- Any members apart from the Chair and Deputy Chair of the Authority are eligible for appointment to the Committee.
- 9 Whichever members are selected should be appointed to serve until the next ordinary local elections in May 2022. The terms of office of members of the Standards Committee would then expire as follows:
 - 2 independent members second term expires in December 2017
 - 1 independent member second term expires August 2018
 - 1 independent member second term expires March 2020
 - 2 Fire Authority members May 2022 (dependent on who is appointed, one or both could be eligible for reappointment for a further term).
- 10 Members are requested to note that the term of office for two of the independent members expires in December 2017. Both members have already served two terms and cannot therefore be reappointed. The Authority will need to advertise for two replacements which it will seek to do jointly with a county council if possible.

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To appoint four Fire and Rescue Authority members to serve on the Firefighters' Pension Scheme Local Pension Board.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

To appoint four Fire and Rescue Authority members to serve on the Firefighters' Pension Scheme Local Pension Board.

RECOMMENDATION

- 3 Members are asked to:
 - (i) note the information in the report;
 - (ii) nominate four representatives on the local pension board.

BACKGROUND

The Local Pension Board was established in 2015 following the introduction of the Public Service Pensions Act 2013 in relation to the Firefighters' Pension Schemes. The board has to include employer and employee representatives in equal numbers. As a consequence North Wales Fire and Rescue Authority will be required to nominate four members to sit on this board.

INFORMATION

The Public Service Pension Act 2013 provides for clearer governance arrangements with specific defined roles, the publication of more information on a consistent basis, and administration practices in line with those in the private sector.

- 6 Local Pension Boards are charged with helping the scheme manager (Fire and Rescue Authority) to ensure that the scheme is operated to an appropriate standard and, in particular, will:
 - ensure that pension schemes are administered in accordance with all relevant legislation and any directions given to the scheme by the Pensions Regulator
 - assist the scheme manager (Fire and Rescue Authority) in securing the effective and efficient administration of the pension scheme
 - have appropriate knowledge about the scheme they are helping to run
 - ensure that information is available to scheme members and other interested parties so that they can easily see and understand who is a pension board member, how pension scheme members are represented on the pension board and the responsibilities of the pension board
 - prevent a person from being a member of a pension board where they have another interest that could prejudice them carrying out the role.
- The scheme manager (Fire and Rescue Authority) is responsible for appointing members of the pension board. The scheme manager must ensure that no conflict of interest exists at the time of a member's appointment, and while the member continues to serve. Conflict of interest is defined as a financial or other interest which is likely to prejudice a person's exercise of functions as a member of a pension board.
- The Firefighters' Pension Schemes are accounted for in the NWFRA accounts as it is ultimately funded by Welsh Government (WG) in accordance with the relevant legislation. The Treasurer is responsible for certifying the claims to WG and they are audited each year by the external auditors. It would also be appropriate that the Monitoring Officer and Treasurer should have the right to attend or be represented at the local pension board meetings.

Member Requirements

- A member of a public service pension board must be conversant with the rules of the scheme and any document recording policy about the administration of the scheme.
- A member must have knowledge and understanding of the law relating to pensions and any other matters which are prescribed in regulation.

An e-learning programme is provided by the Regulator to meet the needs of all pension board members.

To enable the North Wales Fire and Rescue Authority to consider whether it wishes to introduce webcasting for full meetings.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- Each of the six constituent councils now webcast meetings of their full council and some also webcast other meetings of interest to the public. The Welsh Government had previously included a requirements for councils to webcast their meetings in a local government bill. Previously, a grant has been made available to Welsh councils to support the introduction of webcasting but not the on-going revenue costs.
- This report sets out how the introduction of webcasting for North Wales Fire and Rescue Authority meetings might work, based on the existing knowledge and expertise of staff within each of the constituent authorities. The Authority would have to agree a policy; have its web enabled; licence some software; make an agreement with each host local authority; have trained staff/borrow trained staff from each authority.
- There would be technical issues, costs issues, software licence issues and staffing issues to operating webcasting. The benefit would be the potential for greater public engagement.
- Given the rotational nature of Authority meetings, the introduction of webcasting may be impractical with the costs far outweighing the benefits.
- If there were an agreement in principle to the introduction of webcasting for Fire and Rescue Authority meetings then further work would be needed with an action plan and more detailed costings for implementation.

RECOMMENDATIONS

8 That Members consider whether to proceed with plans for webcasting.

BACKGROUND

- 9 Each of the six constituent councils now webcast their full council meetings. Some of the authorities also webcast other meetings. The Authority has discussed in recently whether to offer a similar facility for the public to be able to view our meetings.
- If the Authority decided that it does wish to go ahead then an action plan would be needed for webcasting to be operational within a given time scale. It would involve a modest budget and the agreement of the six council to allow access to their systems, with operator support from the host council being provided at each meeting.
- Some adjustments to meeting arrangements may be required. There would have to be pre-set seating plans for each host council chamber and both members and officers would need to receive some briefing/training over how to participate in a webcast meeting.
- This report sets out an approach to the introduction of webcasting for North Wales Fire and Rescue Authority meetings based on the existing knowledge and expertise of staff within each of the constituent authorities. The Authority would have to agree a policy, have its website enabled, licenced some software, make an agreement with each host local authority, and draw on trained staff from each host authority.
- There will be technical issues, costs issues, software licence issues and staffing issues. The benefit would be the potential for greater public engagement.
- Given the rotational nature of Authority meetings, the introduction of webcasting may be impractical with the costs far outweighing the benefits.
- 15 If there was an agreement in principle to the introduction of webcasting for Fire and Rescue Authority meetings then officers would produce an action plan and more detailed costings for implementation.

INFORMATION

- The most cost efficient way of introducing webcasting for Authority meetings would be for each of the constituent authorities, when they 'host' the meeting on a rotational basis to stream the meeting onto their own microsite. This would cost only the actual hours used from the contract of the individual council. However, given that some authorities already limit the number of their own meetings which they webcast because of the number of hours allowed by their respective contracts with the service provider, this may not be feasible, There would need to be a link from the Fire and Rescue Authority's website to individual council's microsites. In addition, the operation of a webcast has a cost to each Authority, in terms of staff time.
- An alternative approach would be for a new microsite to be built specifically for the Fire and Rescue Authority. The host council would then be able to stream the webcast to the Fire and Rescue Authority microsite. This would cost £600 as a one off cost and would still use individual council's webcasting hours allocation.
